**Tips for success**

- Create A4 revision sheets - one per topic - for topics that you have found difficult - keep these in a revision folder.
- Commit to revising and practising one or two topics per week, in addition to class/homework - identify those topics before the start of the week and get them ticked off.
- Don't waste time practising questions/topics you are already confident with (learn/practise things that you don't know or you are not confident with).
- Create a revision poster with all the formulae you need to know/use (it is best to memorise the ones on the exam paper formulae sheet as well, as this will save you time in the exam).
- Memorise formulae/processes by looking, covering, writing down, checking.
