Year 7 (2015-16)	85% of pupil premium funded children attain expected compared to 80% other in English In English and Maths pupil premium funded children make more rapid progress on average.
Year 8 (2015-16)	Attainment and progress are expected in English and Maths. This is in line with other children.
Year 9 (2015-16)	67% and 66% of pupil premium funded children are making at least expected progress in English and Maths respectively
