



Remote Learning Provision 2021

To prepare children for remote learning:

Last term, we worked with the children to ensure that they were confident in using Moodle, our online platform. We also checked that they could also learn independently and modelled good practice of how to do this. All pupils in school practised and developed this skill in term 1.

If a setback occurs:

If a child has technical difficulties, please contact the coach who will refer the child to the technical team and liaise with the family to solve the problem. It is important not to set up alternatives like sending work directly to the teacher wherever possible.

Our aims:

- We are seeking to give families the maximum flexibility and support when providing good quality remote learning.
- We know children have a clear learning pattern: new content, checking the learning, feeding back to ensure understanding of how to progress. We aim to replicate this in remote learning.
- We want to continue working to our values and will work closely with families as a community.

Here is a summary of the provision we will offer:

- Pupils will have a timetable of lessons to follow, corresponding to the work set on Moodle. There are four learning sessions a day to allow time for pupils to complete the independent work, but includes all of their usual school timetable.
- Schemes of work will cover new content
- Schemes of work will be delivered by staff in filmed/recorded lessons, allowing students to watch at their own pace and be taught by our teachers. This approach gives families the most flexibility to access the lessons and allows children to work at their own pace.



- In addition, children will have a live learning session per subject every week to increase the variety of approach and give pupils the opportunity to interact with their teachers more directly.
- Online quizzes will be set to allow students to see how well they have understood the lessons, and allow them to have another go if they are not pleased with their score.
- Children will be shown how to complete the tasks set by their teachers and will be expected to complete these and upload them to Moodle.
- Staff will give personalised feedback weekly on Moodle, which automatically sends an email to the student alerting them to this feedback. Sometimes this feedback will include a grade or score.
- Staff will also deliver a lesson to feedback on the class learning and using good examples to close any gaps in the learning.
- The five weeks of learning will resemble a scheme of work at school and will include the usual assessments.
- Coaches will contact parents weekly to report back on the student's rate of learning and progress.
- As a school, we will praise and celebrate those pupils who are regularly completing all of their remote learning and showcase particularly good examples of independent work to celebrate the students' achievements.
- In addition to recorded lessons, live learning and independent tasks, we will offer enrichment activities to families. These activities will provide challenge and interest beyond the usual curriculum and will give opportunities to learn in non-digital ways.

In addition, we will work with the families of those children who are finding it difficult to engage in order to remove any barriers and ensure they make good progress. All families will have regular contact with school.
