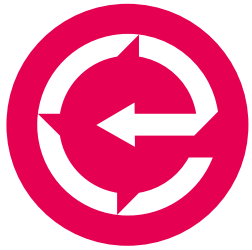

Unfortunately, the stadium is under construction so the merchandise shop was closed, however the students still had a look around some of the available pop-up shops. It was then time to head into the stands to watch the players warm up. This was another fantastic opportunity for many students to watch world class players conduct a warm-up. Just before the game started we got to watch the light show which included lights, music and fire on the pitch!

The trip was a huge success, despite the wet weather, and the students had a fabulous day.



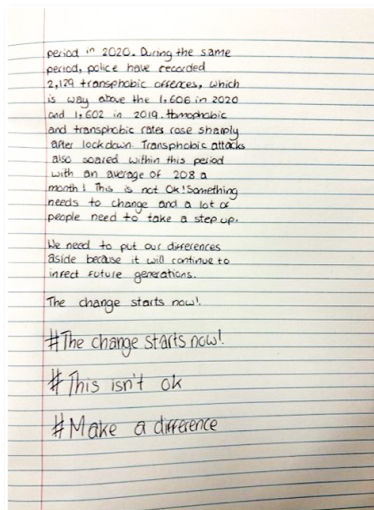
Students in Mrs Mistry's Year 9 PSHCE have been exploring what it means to have a voice and use your voice to effect change in the world.

Here are some of the amazing pieces of protest our students created.

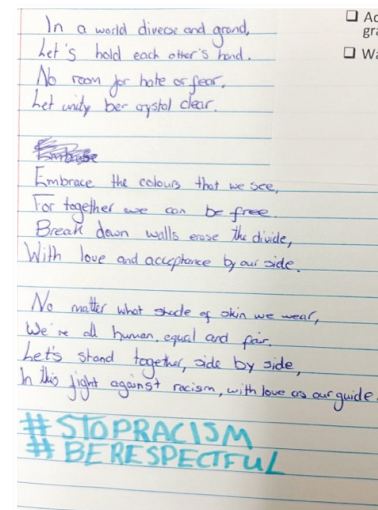

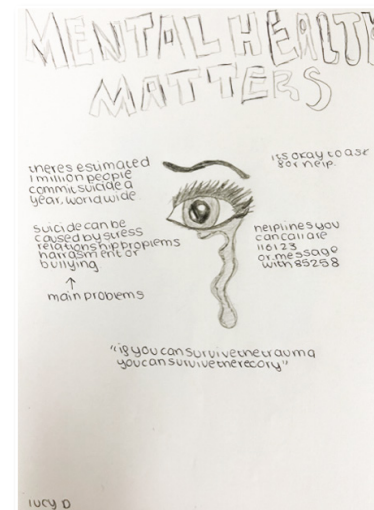

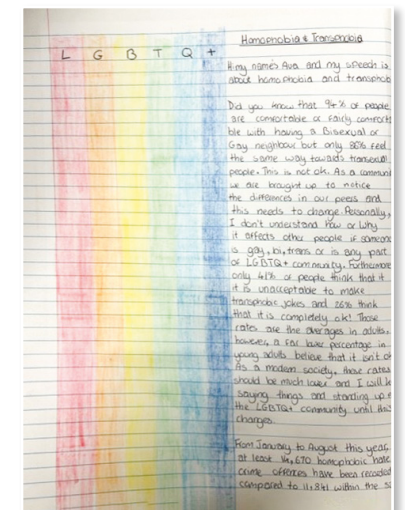

Recipe of the Week

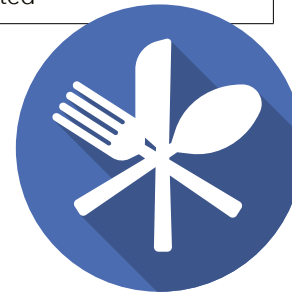
Sloppy Joes

with Brussels sprout slaw



You will need:

1 tbsp vegetable oil	1 green pepper - diced	400ml passata	250g Brussels sprouts
3 garlic cloves - crushed	2 carrots	1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce	1 onion - finely chopped
300g lean beef mince	1 tsp ground cumin	3 tbsp low-fat natural yogurt	2 tbsp cider vinegar
4 wholemeal bread rolls, toasted			

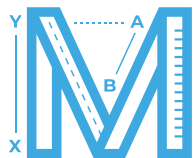


How to prepare:

1. Heat the oil in a frying pan and add the beef until brown all over.
2. Reduce the heat and add the onion, pepper, garlic and cumin. Cook for 2 minutes.
3. Add the passata, Worcestershire sauce, half of the vinegar and a pinch of sugar. Simmer for 15-20mins.
4. Finely slice the carrots and sprouts.
5. Add the remaining vinegar and yogurt in a bowl and season.
6. Stir in the carrots and sprouts and mix together.
7. Add all the ingredients together inside the bread rolls, serve and enjoy!
