On Tuesday 24th October students in Year 9, 10 and 11 drama and music classes were invited to a performance of 'Romeo and Juliet' by visiting actors from Leeds Conservatoire of Music.



The third year performing arts students shared a wonderful version of the famous Shakespearean tragedy which included a diverse cast, live music from actor musicians and stage combat. The acting and directing was well thought out and engaging and the students were outstanding audience members right until the fateful end of Romeo and Juliet.



After the performance, students in Years 10 and 11 drama took part in a workshop with the actors, to explore the Shakespearean text, and learn how to make the words sound modern.

The trip was a huge success, despite the wet weather, and the students had a fabulous day.




Students in Mrs Mistry's Year 9 PSHCE have been exploring what it means to have a voice and use your voice to effect change in the world.

Throughout the unit they explored a range of different themes and issues and explored how others have used their voice to raise awareness.


During the final two weeks of the unit, students were challenged to use their voice to create a piece of work that makes others stop and think about an issue in our society.



Sloppy Joes



with Brussels sprout slaw

You will need:

| 1 tbsp vegetable oil | 1 green pepper - diced | 400ml passata | 250g Brussels sprouts |
|-----------------------------|------------------------|-------------------------------|--------------------------|
| 3 garlic cloves - crushed | 2 carrots | 1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce | 1 onion - finely chopped |
| 300g lean beef mince | 1 tsp ground cumin | 3 tbsp low-fat natural yogurt | 2 tbsp cider vinegar |
| 4 wholemeal bread rolls, to | pasted | | |





- 1. Heat the oil in a frying pan and add the beef until brown all over.
- **2.** Reduce the heat and add the onion, pepper, garlic and cumin. Cook for 2 minutes.
- **3.** Add the passata, Worcestershire sauce, half of the vinegar and a pinch of sugar. Simmer for 15-20mins.
- **4.** Finely slice the carrots and sprouts.
- **5.** Add the remaining vinegar and yogurt in a bowl and season.
- **6.** Stir in the carrots and sprouts and mix together.
- **7.** Add all the ingredients together inside the bread rolls, serve and enjoy!
