

We had a fantastic time on our Basecamp Expedition. On the first day, we went on a navigation activity. We were split in pairs, given maps and

told to navigate our way to a cave. We took it in turns to map read. The path was long and all uphill but we saw highland cows and piglets at the end.

That night we went abseiling off a cliff in the pitch black making it much more challenging and frightening. When we were at the bottom of the abseil, we supported and encouraged our friends to keep going.

On the second day, we went on a day long walk. This walk was very challenging and pushed most of us to the limit. We climbed up a mountain in a storm that consisted of bitter winds that were up to 50mph and harsh rain that drenched us. We were freezing!



We conquered the mountain and we were all so proud of ourselves. As a reward, we all received a hot chocolate in a nearby lakeside café and enjoyed the view of the lake and mountains.

On the final day, we took part in a survival activity. This was lighting a fire using Kelly kettles (to make hot chocolate) and building a den using only natural resources. We used a flint and steel to make a spark that we could use to light a cotton ball and then added sticks to grow the fire. When making the den, we were given 45 mins to plan, collect resources and build. After we had built the den we were told to be persuasive and sell our shelter. After much negotiation we settled at £45,000. To finish our activity, we roasted marshmallows on the fire we had manage to light.






NUMERACY MATHS PUZZLE

Put four coins on a table, all tails up, like this:




Turn any three coins over: this counts as one move.

FRANCOPHONE RECIPES CHERRY CLAFOUTIS

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INGREDIENTS

- 2 teaspoons very soft butter
- 1 pound cherries
- 1 cup milk
- 1/2 cup sugar

- 1/2 cup flour
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons melted butter
- 3 eggs
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract

INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1

Preheat the oven to 350°F (180°C). Use the soft butter to generously grease a 10 inch diameter tart or cake pan.

STEP 2

Wash and dry the cherries and remove the stems. There is no need to pit the cherries, although you can if you wish. The pits are said to add extra flavour to the dish.

STEP 3

Evenly distribute the cherries in the buttered pan. Place the two tablespoons of butter in a small dish that can go in the microwave. Cover with a piece of paper towel in case it explodes. Microwave on high for about 30 seconds - just enough to melt the butter.

STEP 4

Whisk together the flour, sugar, and salt in a mixing bowl. Whisk in the milk. Whisk in the eggs, melted butter and vanilla extract. Pour this batter on top of the cherries.

STEP 5

Place the pan in the preheated oven and bake for 45 minutes or until the custard is cooked through.

STEP 6

Serve warm or cold.
