





In Endeavor this term, students have completed a two session task, creating a shoebox sized stage that would be suitable for the upcoming show - School of Rock!



CLASSIC FRENCH CRÊPE

INGREDIENTS

- 1 ¼ cup milk 10 fl oz
- 3 large eggs
- 2 tbsp oil or melted butter
- 2 tsp sugar for savoury crêpes, *OR*
- 3 tbsp sugar for sweet dessert crêpes
- ½ tsp salt
- 4 oz all purpose flour (almost 1 cup)

INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1

Place the milk and eggs in a jug/bowl. Whisk to combine (you should have about 2 cups of liquid).

STEP 2

Add the oil or butter and whisk it in.

STEP 3

Place the flour, salt and sugar in a large bowl. Add about ¾ - 1 cup of the liquid and mix gently to form a smooth paste. This should not take more than a few seconds. Take care not to overmix. Add the rest of the liquid and mix to form a smooth, watery batter.



STEP 4

Cover the batter and let it rest for at least 20 - 30 minutes. The batter can be kept in the fridge overnight as well (or upto 2 days).

STEP 5

Preheat a 10 inch non-stick pan over medium heat. Brush a layer of butter on the heated pan. Always mix the batter first, before you make each crepe. Pour ¼ cup of the batter into the hot pan, and swirl to coat the bottom of the pan. Swirl and spread the batter along the edge of the pan first and then fill the middle with the remaining crepe batter. Make sure the batter is as evenly spread as possible. Place the pan back on the heat to let the crepe cook. Flip when it no longer sticks to the pan!

STEP 6

Serve with whatever toppings you like!
