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
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# PHYSICS OLYMPICS

# Titanic James Horner

The film "Titanic" is a classic romantic drama that tells the tragic story of the RMS Titanic's ill-fated maiden voyage. One significant aspect



of the film is how music is intricately woven throughout, enhancing the emotional depth of the story. The iconic theme song "My Heart Will Go On" by Celine Dion became synonymous with the film and perfectly captured the love between Jack and Rose. The music in "Titanic" serves as a powerful tool to evoke various emotions, from joy to sorrow, and adds layers of meaning to pivotal scenes. James Horner's beautiful score further elevates the film, creating a memorable and immersive viewing experience.

The Titanic theme song, "My Heart Will Go On" by Celine Dion, is prominently featured throughout the film. It plays during key moments, such as when Jack and Rose first meet on the ship's deck, during their romantic moments together, and notably during the heart-breaking climax as the ship sinks. The effect of this recurring theme is to evoke a sense of nostalgia, love, and tragedy, intensifying the emotional impact of the story. Once again, reminding the audience of their relationship and the character development across the film. The audience have an immediate familiarity and can associate it to their relationship. I feel this final theme fits as a perfect ending as we can reflect not only on the story but the emotional journey the audience have experienced.

# Harry Potter & The Deathly Hallows Part 2

This film, in my opinion, has one of the greatest and most emotional opening scores to a film of all time. The opening score is called "Lily's theme". The music opens with a low drone in C#, played by a cello with a very thin texture, almost sounding like a horn blown whilst entering battle, which represents the theme of violence and war that runs throughout the film. It makes the setting feel eerie and desolate, almost abandoned and left to rot. As an audience we are left speechless and intrigued to watch on to see what will come next. No words are spoken by any of the characters at the start of the film. We are shown panoramas of the wizarding world as this drone is played, formerly a flourishing place filled with happiness, but is now filled with corruption, death and suffering. Not much is revealed to the audience in the first few seconds of the film, and the music further gives a feeling of mysteriousness and secrets due to the use of such thin texture and the extreme lack of percussion.

The original "Hedwig's theme" is completely missing throughout the film, which shows how the whole idea and franchise of Harry Potter is slowly coming to an end and that the main themes of the films are greatly weakened. The piece of music has a lone female singing voice suggesting that Harry is completely alone in his fight against Voldemort and will have no outside help from even his school with the presence of Snape as headmaster. The music then slowly builds into a thicker texture with violins playing the lead vocal lines instead of the singing. This gradual increase



of more instruments shows how at the start things are mysterious and unpredictable, and then as the title of the film comes through and the texture thickens, things are revealed and the audience realise that this is the end of the franchise.

# FRANCOPHONE RECIPES



# AFRICAN CHAPATI

# **INGREDIENTS**

- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 1/4 cups water
- 1/2 teaspoon salt



# INSTRUCTIONS

# STEP 1

In a large mixing bowl, combine flour, water, and salt. Stir until well combined. Transfer to a floured surface and knead for 5-7 minutes. The dough should come together to be soft and smooth.

# STEP 2

Place dough into a lightly oiled bowl and cover with plastic wrap. Let rest for about 1 hour.

# STEP 3

Heat a lightly oiled skillet or griddle to medium-high heat.

# STEP 4

Remove from bowl and divide into 8 evenly sized pieces. Roll out each piece so that it is about 1/4" thick.

Transfer chapati to the skillet and cook for about 30-60 seconds or until golden brown dots start to form on the bottom. Flip and continue to cook until the other side forms those same dots. If a large bubble forms in the middle, gently press it down.



STEP 5

Transfer to a serve platter and cover until ready to serve.
