COACHING THIS HALF-TERM



In coaching this half-term, we have been working with our students to look at ways they can develop how reflective they are of themselves and how they can approach challenges and new experiences with positivity and confidence.

Students have been looking at how their mindset is key to how they view the world around them. They have been thinking about the differences between a 'fixed' mindset and a 'growth' mindset. One of the ways our mindsets can affect our thoughts and perceptions is that a fixed mindset can often lead to avoiding challenges for fear of criticism or self-doubt, whilst a growth mindset encourages students to see challenges as an experience from which they can learn and develop and also see feedback as a way of self-improvement.

Students have been reflecting on their mindsets and how they view themselves in preparation for Challenge Day which took place on Friday 4th April.

During Challenge Day, students are set different challenges to complete by the Year 11 students in an attempt to win the most points to be crowned the winning coaching group of Challenge Day. The challenges can involve competing against the clock or competing against another person. Developing and fostering a growth mindset in relation to Challenge Day encourages students to participate and seek out new experiences whilst using their resolve, patience and concentration across a variety of different challenges.

We will continue to work with students around the idea of mindsets as we look to explore how students can use a growth mindset in their learning and in other events across the school.

BEING WELL-PREPARED FOR LEARNING - EQUIPMENT

It is important to students' learning that they are properly equipped for every lesson.

Students should arrive each day at school with:

- A black school bag.
- A pencil case with: black ink pen, green ink pen, whiteboard pen, pencil, ruler.
- A scientific calculator. A calculator is a key piece of equipment that all students will require for use in their maths, science and geography lessons. By having their own calculator, students will become familiar with its use which will support them when they require them for lessons and assessments. Please can you ensure that your child is well-prepared for their learning by having a calculator with them in school every day.

To support you with this, calculators can be purchased for £12.65 via ParentPay and can be collected from student reception.
