Students can now approach their return in September, having already begun to foster positive relationships with their new teachers and ready to pick up their new learning straight away.





We look forward to Sports Day on Friday 11th July.




MOBILE PHONE & ONLINE SAFETY WEBINAR

EQUIPMENT

- A scientific calculator. A calculator is a key piece of equipment that all students will require for use in their maths, science and geography lessons. By having their own calculator, students will become familiar with its use which will support them when they require them for lessons and assessments. Please can you ensure that your child is well-prepared for their learning by having a calculator with them in school every day.

To support you with this, calculators can be purchased for **£12.65** via **ParentPay** and can be collected from student reception.

UNIFORM
